## WEEK 1: THE WORD AND BEGINNINGS

*This week, discover Jesus - the eternal Word who became flesh to dwell among us, bringing light and life into a dark world. As John introduces you to Jesus through John the Baptist's testimony and the eyes of His first disciples, prepare to encounter the One who transforms water into wine, marking the first of John's seven signs.*

## WEEK 2: CLEANSING AND NEW LIFE

*This week, **wonder at** Jesus: how He offers so much more than miraculous signs. In His encounters with an intrigued pharisee and a Samaritan woman, we are invited into Jesus' offer of new life. From cleansing the temple to healing an official's son - John's second sign - each moment in this incredible text points to a Savior who changes hearts and redeems lives.*

*This week, **journey with** Jesus as He heals a paralyzed man, feeds thousands with a few loaves and fish, and walks on water. Stand in awe at His compassion, wisdom and power as you encounter three more of John's seven signs and meditate on Jesus' self-revelation as the Bread of Life.*

## WEEK 4: THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD

This week, **witness** the growing tension as Jesus declares Himself the Light of the World, marking Himself out as the only One who can bring true clarity and hope. Even amid opposition and misunderstanding, Christ's truth shines brightly, inviting us to step into the light of His life.

This week, feel the weight of sorrow as Jesus mourns with Mary and Martha, then rejoice as He raises Lazarus from the dead, foreshadowing His victory over death itself. As Jesus moves toward the cross, immerse yourself in the depth of His love and His unwavering commitment to glorify the Father.
